Whose is a wh-word, but Who's (which sounds the same) is the short form for Who is.

We can also ask wh-questions beginning with question phrases.

Talking about people, places or things (Indefinite and definite articles)

When we mention something for the first time or refer to one of many things, we use the indefinite articles a or an. We use them only before singular countable nouns.



	Use	Examples
а	before a consonant sound	Tina is a student. She wears a uniform.
an	before a vowel sound	Mr Jones is an artist. He will arrive in an hour.

We use the **definite article** the in the following situations and no article in the situations below.






